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## 1.0 PURPOSE

1.1 The purpose of this policy is to ensure that proper precautions are taken when operating utility vehicles.

#### 2.0 SCOPE

2.1 Utility vehicles include battery-power and gas-power carts such as golf carts, gators, and maintenance carts.

### 3.0 GENERAL

- 3.1 Vehicle Safety Requirements
  - 3.1.1 All carts will be equipped with the following safety features:
    - a) Riding and parking brakes.
    - Headlight(s) if the vehicle will be operated outside between dusk till dawn or in darkened areas of the mill such as basements.
    - c) Amber rotating or flashing beacon warning light on the roof.
    - d) Reverse alert horn/beeper.

## 3.1.2 Seatbelts:

- a) All individuals shall use the seat belts installed by the vehicle or mobile equipment manufacturer, properly adjusted and securely fastened.
- b) Additionally, no one shall operate or ride in the utility vehicle if the seat belt is inoperable (operators or passengers).
- Manufacturer-installed seat belts shall not be modified, removed, deactivated, or otherwise tampered with except for maintenance and repair.
- d) If seat belts are determined to be defective and/or inoperable, the utility vehicle shall be removed from service until repairs are made.
- 3.1.3 All carts should be properly maintained. Any cart, found to have safety equipment defect and/or malfunction, should be immediately tagged with a DO NOT OPERATE sign and removed from service.
- 3.1.4 All carts will be signed an asset number and have PMs performed every six months. PMs will focus on safety equipment maintenance, general vehicle care, and cleaning.
- 3.1.5 Chargers for battery powered carts must only be plugged into Ground Fault Circuit Interrupts (GFCI) outlets.



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- 3.1.6 Battery powered carts will only be charged in well ventilated areas away from spark producing devices (grinders, welders, burning rigs, etc.).
- 3.1.7 Gas powered vehicles are not allowed to idle in enclosed areas for extensive periods of time.
- 3.2 Driver and Passenger Safety
  - 3.2.1 Perform cart safety check daily before use (checklist below). Checklist will be kept on vehicle.
  - 3.2.2 Mill PPE required hard hats, safety glasses, gloves, and safety shoes.
  - 3.2.3 Always maintain 3 point contact when entering or exiting a Utility Vehicle.
  - 3.2.4 Drive with amber rotating or flashing beacon warning light on at all times. If beacon is inoperable the vehicle shall be taken out of service immediately and tagged with a DO NOT OPERATE sign.
  - 3.2.5 Smoking, eating, or drinking is prohibited when operating a Utility Vehicle.
  - 3.2.6 Operating a Utility Vehicle while under the influence alcohol or any controlled substance, including prescription drugs, is strictly prohibited.
  - 3.2.7 Stunt driving and horseplay is strictly forbidden.
  - 3.2.8 Headlights must be used in dark conditions where operating without them may present a danger to occupants of the car or those around them.
  - 3.2.9 Carts must not be overloaded with personnel or equipment.
    - a) Do not exceed carrying capabilities. Equipment shall not be modified in any manner that affects capacity or designed purpose without the manufacturer's written permission. This will include racks, lifts, bumpers, hitches.
    - b) All riders must be safely seated in designated seating. CANNOT sit, stand, kneel, etc. on any part of the vehicle not designed for passengers.
    - c) Do not place arms and legs outside the confines of the cart.
    - d) No standing on carts.
  - 3.2.10 Ensure parking brakes are engaged when parked and exiting the cart.
  - 3.2.11 Utility Vehicle Operators must be stopped when using a cell phone or any other electronic device, including radios.



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- 3.2.12 During the fueling operation (if applicable) of a Utility Vehicle, no cell phones or other electronic devices, including mill radios, may be used.
- 3.3 Traffic and Pedestrian Safety:
  - 3.3.1 Follow normal traffic routes, speed limits, and rules at all times.
  - 3.3.2 Carts are not to be operated in areas marked as No Motor Vehicle areas.
  - 3.3.3 Maintain safe distances (10 feet, if possible) from pedestrians when approaching, following, and passing. Sound horn once before passing or make visual contact with individuals.
  - 3.3.4 Maintain safe distances from other vehicles on mill roads. When possible, avoid blind spots. If not possible, sound horn.
  - 3.3.5 Never park a vehicle in front of an exit, stairs, fire hose, fire extinguisher, or fire hydrant.
  - 3.3.6 Never park vehicle on an incline unless the wheels are chocked and parking brake set
  - 3.3.7 Indoor Use:
    - a) Carts must be operated at a walking speed.
    - b) Operators will slow down at all corners, intersections, or other areas where visibility is restricted and sound horn before proceeding.
  - 3.3.8 Vehicle Safety Checklist
    - a) Safety lights work properly.
    - b) Tires are properly inflated with no excessive wear.
    - c) Reverse alert horn/beeper operates properly.
    - d) Riding and parking brakes work properly.
  - 3.3.9 Training
    - a) Department Managers will identify and authorize personnel who are required to operate Utility Vehicles.
    - b) All employees who operate Utility Vehicles are to:
      - Perform safety inspections on the vehicle,

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• Understand safe operating techniques and basic maintenance of vehicle (oil, water, fuel, battery charging/changing, etc.).

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• Review this policy annually. Records of certification will be kept in the Learning Management System.
